

CRANE-BESHAR RHINOCEROS CREEK RESERVATION

Northeast Parcel 59 acres
Parking at end of Bonny Drive

Rhinoceros Creek Reservation was originally part of farmlands surrounding Gerard Crane's Stone House. Crane died in 1872 with outstanding debts making it impossible for his heirs to retain the property. A large aquifer beneath the land caught the attention of Heritage Hills developers who purchased and placed a water easement on it before it changed hands again.

After purchasing the Stone House in 1984, the Beshar family obtained both parcels of the reservation at auction, later donating them to Somers Land Trust.
